

Assessment of Cases for Student Awards

The Postgraduate Clinical Award is awarded to a student case as judged by the assessors. The case may not necessarily be the best finished case. The assessors should take into account the difficulty of the case and if the candidate appears to have a clear understanding of the factors that contributed to success and also, as appropriate, factors which may have compromised the result. The assessors should judge how the candidate managed any difficulties that arose.

That below just outlines some of the aspects to take into account when assessing the student cases. These are guidelines only.

The assessors should appraise the cases and in consultation, come to an overall decision regarding the award recipient. The AOB Chair requires only the name of the recipient and any other notes regarding the assessment are for your use only. Any notes may be handed to the Chair or Registrar so they can be discarded in a manner where confidentiality is not breached.
